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CHARLES SABINE

EMMY AWARD WINNING, GLOBAL SPOKESPERSON FOR HD AND NOW KEY NOTE SPEAKER FOR NZ NATIONAL CONFERENCE

Charles Sabine is an Emmy award winner for News & documentary. He worked for NBC news for 26 years before becoming a global spokesperson for individuals with HD. He is also gene positive.

His message is "not to give up on life". It was in a London pub that he wrote the slogan 'HDdennomore' ('Hidden No More') and set about trying to host a HDdenomore event at the Vatican. The initial idea was to have one Venezuelan (Venezuela was where the HD gene was found by a researcher) family member meet the Pope and get a photo taken. A testament to Pope Francis is that he allowed the numbers to steadily increase to 150 individuals from 28 countries to stand together and say the words "The time has come for this to be hidden no more".





MEETING POPE FRANCIS

Charles has witnessed many extraordinary events in his life, including the Berlin Wall and the end of Apartheid in South Africa. But he says none of them compare to the feeling in the room on that day, "It was truly magical moment".

We were there.

New Zealand was not only honoured by being mentioned as the group who had travelled the longest distance but we were also privileged to be allocated VIP seating. This enabled us to be one of the 150 out of the 2000 individuals to have a personal encounter with Pope Francis.

An amazingly sacred journey was had by all.

It was a dream come true to have Charles Sabine as one of our keynote speakers, alongside our international guest Professor Julie Stout from Monash university and our local HD Heroes: Sir Richard Faull and Professor Maurice Cuties from Centre of Brain Research at Auckland University.

Charles was very busy while in Auckland. Prior to the Conference we were able to have a reunion with most of the individuals who attended the Rome trip with Charles.


Over 80% of funds are put towards education and awareness to help increase understanding and support for individuals with HD to create social inclusion within their community.




